Established in 1976, the Special Interest Music Centre at Brighton is one of 4 government funded Special Interest Music programs in Adelaide.

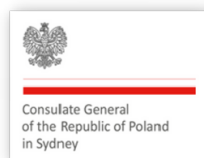
Students have the opportunity to study music with students of similar interests, abilities and passion. Special Interest Music (or SIM) students work alongside in-zone Core Music students in co-curricular ensembles.

There are currently 25 co-curricular ensembles for students to participate in, from small groups, guitar ensemble and string quartets to the symphony orchestra, concert band, concert choir and big bands.

There is an international music tour every 2 years. Recent destinations have included China, Malaysia, Italy, Austria, Germany, the Czech Republic, Poland (2015 and 2019), Finland and Norway.

The music faculty comprises a dedicated team of highly-skilled classroom, ensemble and instrumental staff striving to inspire students through the best possible music program.

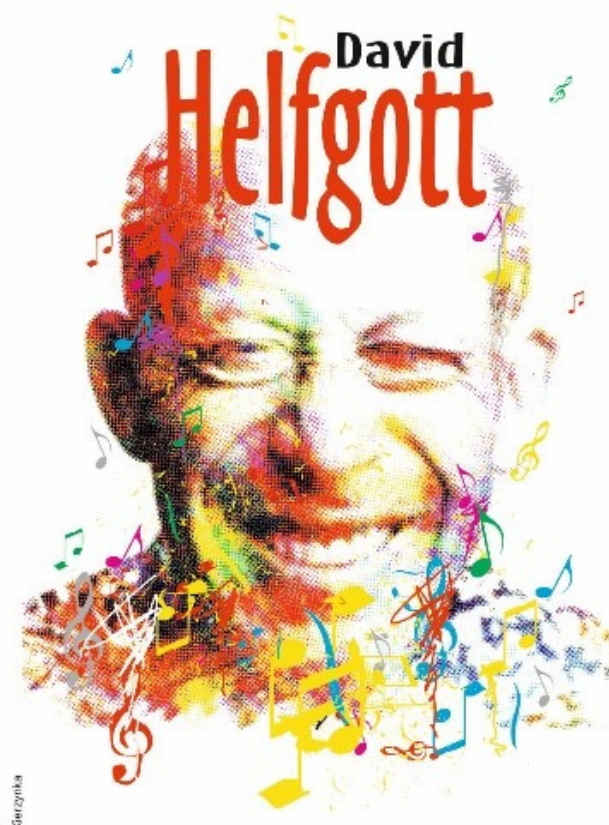
